Looking ahead

Oftentimes this line serves as a source of motivation for me, but it also reminds me to plan ahead. The American Angus Auxiliary and state auxiliaries across the country now have the opportunity to plan ahead as we look toward implementing the bylaw changes that were approved at our 2007 annual meeting.

The biggest change is the addition of six regional directors to our Executive Committee. The regional directors will be elected by a majority vote at the annual meeting in November, and the Nominating Committee will assist each region in selecting up to two candidates from its region. The Nominating Committee will develop a process for this, but in the meantime, we need each Auxiliary member to begin thinking of candidates from their region. The regional directors will serve a two-year term and can be elected for two consecutive terms. Their responsibilities will include:

- assisting states without organized auxiliaries in setting up a state auxiliary;
- recruiting members from their region;

- improving communication between the American Angus Auxiliary and state and regional Angus auxiliaries;
- keeping contact lists up to date;
- securing state contacts in all states without organized auxiliaries; and
- attending annual, midyear and Executive Committee meetings of the American Angus Auxiliary.

I envision regional directors also serving as informal mentors to the state auxiliaries. They will be able to help bring information to your state or simply lend an ear when you need someone with whom to talk Auxiliary business.

If you have any questions about the regional directors, please don't hesitate to contact one of the officers. We feel this change will be valuable for our organization, and when change is put into a positive perspective, it turns from a challenge into an opportunity for success. The directors will be a positive addition to our team as we work together toward a common vision.

The current officers will also be attending

several upcoming shows, sales and meetings in their parts of the country, so if you would like for us to visit with your Auxiliary leadership, members or potential members, please let us know. We are only a phone call or e-mail away, and we would enjoy learning more about your auxiliary and the interests and concerns you have.

Recruit and encourage

I would like to encourage interested persons to join their state and/or regional auxiliaries and the American Angus Auxiliary. spring sale and calving season to enjoy your family and friends.


