Twenty-seven outstanding high school graduates from nineteen states competed this year for the American Angus Auxiliary scholarships. The scholarships went to five females and five males totaling \$12,000. The first place scholarship in both the male and female division was in the amount of \$1,400, second place \$1,300, third \$1,200, fourth \$1,100 and fifth \$1,000. Winners were announced and presented framed certificates at the National Junior Angus Show Awards Program in Denver.

One of the main priorities of the American Angus Auxiliary is to give money and recognition to our deserving youth. Since 1956, \$310,600 has been awarded in scholarships to 370 Angus youth from 39 different states.
