American Angus Auxiliary Mid-Year Meeting

Tuesday, July 10, 2018 - Madison WI

President, Leslie Mindemann, welcomed all to the Mid-Year Meeting and announced we would need to go out of order of the agenda and announced Miss American Angus, Kallie Knott, for her update.

The Mid-Year meeting was then called to order at 5:12 pm.

Leslie advised the minutes of the 2017 Mid-Year Meeting were in the packets for this meeting. Julie Conover made to the motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes. Pam Velisek seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Leslie announced Secretary-Treasurer, Gina Hope, deferred to the Bookkeeper the discussion of the Financial Report. After discussing the Financial Report and current Balance Sheet, Leslie announced the Auxiliary has a loss of \$12,638.90 partially due to the outstanding balance Women's Connected Conference funds from the AAA Foundation.

Rachel Frost asked if the Auxiliary still has the Angus Gift Barn trailer. Leslie answered, yes. It has been depreciated out and therefore is not visible on the Balance Sheet.

Nancy Thelan made the motion to accept the Financial Report. Carol Bloom seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Leslie introduced Guests, Executive Committee, Committee Chairs, State Presidents, Distinguished Women, Past Presidents.

Oral Committee Reports:

Historian:

Emma Collins, Historian, gave a report on the Scrapbook. She briefly explained her role as Historian and requested state auxiliaries send photos of activities, accomplishments, meetings etc to her for inclusion in each year's scrapbook. She advised she begins putting each year's book together between September and October before it presented to the outgoing Auxiliary President at Annual Convention.

Ways & Means:

Emma Collins also presented an update for the Ways & Means Committee. She advised her mother, Melani Kiani, Anne Lampe and herself work together on this committee. She advised there was all new inventory in the Angus Gift Barn and encouraged all members to stop in and support the Angus Gift Barn this week. Emma also suggested if any of us have ideas for items to carry to please let one of the committee members know.

Cook-Off:

Anne Patton Schubert announced this year's Cook-Off Contest was a "wonderful 5-ring circus". She announced the WI Alliant Energy Exhibition facility was the perfect location for the contest. Anne announced there were 36 teams, approximately 200 "chefs", 7 adult Chef's Challenge teams and 1 junior Chef's Challenge team.

Scholarship:

Cindy Ahearn, Scholarship Chairman, announced there will be \$17,000 in scholarship funds given away this year. There are 5 young men and 5 young ladies receiving the scholarships from 20 applications submitted. Cindy also advised a scholarship workshop was held just before the Mid-Year Meeting and approximately 50 people attended. Cindy also offered anyone attending the Mid-Year Meeting to pickup a folder that was prepared for the workshop if they wanted to.

Silver Pitcher / Crystal Awards:

Kathi Creamer explained what the Silver Pitcher award is (most points achieved by cattle – not any of the other contests) and this award is sponsored by the Auxiliary's Educational Funds. The Crystal Award was explained as well as started in 1997 by Janet Crystal Fairchild. A statue was auctioned and sold for \$4500. \$2,000 went back to the family and \$2500 was placed in an account made for the award. The Crystal award is won by accumulation of points in educational contests (nothing to do with showing cattle). Kathi announced the Auxiliary will accept donations for either of these awards.

Auxiliary Communications:

Cortney Holshouser announced there have been changed made by API (Angus Productions Inc). Effective 7/1/18 we will be charged for web services and printing in the Angus Journal. She wanted membership to know as this change will be reflected in future financial reports. She encouraged members to sign up for Eblast and to follow the Auxiliary on Facebook to ensure they will see all communications from the Auxiliary.

A question was asked – for what are we being charged? Leslie Mindemann answered we will be provided some services gratuitously and we are evaluating how to communicate to membership moving forward. Leslie then asked the membership how many members read the Angus Journal. (Surprisingly, not many – Secretary-Treasurer notes less than 10 hands were raised.) She asked how many use social media. More hands were raised. She asked how many have seen products on Facebook and seeing them there made a purchase. Again, many hands raised. Most agree electronic media is the way to go.
