1. What is happening with your committee?

We continue to monitor the annual budget and finances of the Auxiliary. We continue to review processes for expenses for clarity and efficiency, and how to share financial data most securely between the executive committee and audit committee and decided on dropbox.

- The Finance Committee recommended a total of \$18,000 be awarded in the 2020 scholarship program.
- Our \$10,000 CD was up for renewal in June, 2020. We researched current CD terms and rates and funds were transferred to an 11 month CD.
- We continue to report income and expenses against each of our activities/projects whenever possible, to provide a true profit statement on any fundraisers. We added an “office expense” line item to the budget for clearer tracking of expenses.
- We recommended 25% of our profit from 2018-19 (\$983) and \$5500 from the Full Circle Online Sale be transferred to our scholarship endowment and this has been done.
- We want to thank Leslie Mindemann for her years of service as our bookkeeper and the outstanding job she did in keeping all financial reports up to date and providing information for the committees and executive committee.
- We welcomed Julie Angelo as our new accountant. It has been a pleasure working with her during this transition and helping her to learn more about our Auxiliary and financial reports.

2. How has the pandemic affected the work for your committee?

- We continue to monitor the finances and budget. The pandemic has affected our revenue, as well as some of our expenses.

3. Is there an item or matter that you would like the Executive Committee to discuss at their meeting? If so, what?
