American Angus Auxiliary Mid-Year Meeting July 6, 2022

The meeting was called to order at 4:17pm CST on Wednesday, July 6, 2022 by President Deanna Hofing at the American Royal Complex, Kansas City, MO.

There were 81 members present that included 10 new members. 17 members also joined the meeting via Zoom for a total of 98 members in attendance.

President Deanna Hofing introduced her Executive Board Members: Pam Velisek, Julie Conover, Karla Knapp, Cindy Worthington, Christy Perdue, Rebecca Knott, Valerie Trowbridge, Stacy Erdmann and Amy Griffin. Deanna also welcomed and thanked the Committee Chairs, Charter Members, Distinguished Women, Past Auxiliary Presidents, State Presidents, and the American Angus Association staff.

Miss American Angus Mary Wood gave us an update on her year so far and her new role in conjunction with Certified Angus Beef. Mary has been able to attend outings in North Carolina at the Piggly Wiggly and at Lowe's Foods advocating for the Angus Auxiliary and the beef industry as a whole.

Anne Lampe moved to accept and dispense with the reading of the Mid-Year minutes. Barb Ettredge seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Karla Knapp presented the Treasurer's report. As of May 31, 2022, the total assets were \$71,067.89. We are officially out of the BMO bank and everything but the 5-year CD has been transferred to the Commerce Bank. As of May 31st our accounting position has transferred from Julie Angelo to Amy Griffin. Nancy Thelen and Amy Griffin have been working very hard and the transition has been very smooth. The Statement of Financials has us up from last year about \$8,000. This is mainly due to the 70th year Anniversary kick off and the \$70 letter drive campaign. Another highlight was that our membership is up about \$1130.

Committee Reports

<u>Angus Gift Barn</u>: Lauren Patteson is our new AGB manager from Virginia, she introduced herself and invited us all to stop by and see her new items.

<u>Beef Education</u>: Anne Patton Schubert reported on a very successful cook-off with 33 teams participating.

<u>By-Laws Committee</u>: Carol Wojciechowski proposed changes to the by-laws. These changes will be printed in The Post and put to a vote at the Annual meeting in November.

Section 4.2.4-Appoint Special Committees as authorized by the Auxiliary Council.
 Change "Auxiliary Council" to "Executive Board". The committee agrees with this change.

- Section 4.2.7-Appoint members to fill vacancies in the officer and regional director positions with the approval of the Auxiliary Council. Change "Auxiliary Council" to "Executive Board". This committee agrees with the change.
- Section 7.1- There shall be the following standing committees in addition such other
 committees as deemed necessary to carry on the work of the Auxiliary. The
 committees will report their activities and any recommended actions related to their
 committee to the Auxiliary Council. Change "Auxiliary Council" to "membership" as the
 reports are posted on the website after each meeting. This committee agrees with the
 change.

<u>Full Circle Online Auction</u>: Cortney Holshouser thanked her committee and have 20 consignments on a printed flyer that went out in every exhibitor packet this week. Since the printing she has secured 6 more consignments and will be taking consignments until August 1st. The Auction will be held November 10, 2022 with Angus Live.

<u>Miss American Angus</u>: Cortney Hill-Dukehart Cates and Paige Arnold and her committee are securing sponsorships for the upcoming MAA contest to be held in Salt Lake City, Utah this November.

<u>Membership Committee</u>: Jamie Rutledge updated us that our membership is up to close to 900 members. Our annual membership has increased to \$20. She requested any updates to be emailed out to her.

Nominating Committee: Pam Velisek announced that nominations are now open for Regions 1, 2 and 3 along with Secretary/Treasurer position until August 1st. Applications are to be filled out and returned to her by then. Anyone that has any suggestions for Distinguished Woman to please let her know also.

Scholarship Committee: Julie Conover reported that she had 19 applicants for Scholarship this year. 13 girls and 6 boys. We will be awarding \$20,000 to the top 5 boys and 5 girls on Friday. The committee went over the challenges that Mac users have with the application and what might be done to alleviate this issue. They also went over the change to the one question that happens annually on the application. The updated form will be available in December. Brooke Harward is our liaison for any Scholarship questions, and she will be available to any advisor, parent or applicant.

<u>PR Committee:</u> Megan Green updated us that her and Kalie Rumbold have taken over the committee since November with the mentoring of Julie Murnin. Since then, they have been working on increasing our social media presence.

Old Business

Julie Angelo, our accountant has resigned from her position effective May 31st. Amy Griffin has graciously stepped up and taken over as our new accountant. The transition has been very smooth due to all of Amy's experience with her family's business.

Lynne Hinrichsen reported that the Achievement Awards are on a fillable form that is available online to make it much easier to fill out and send in. Erica Styles and Lynne will be receiving those October 1st.

New Business

Drawing for the Saddle Blanket Bag fundraiser took place with the winner being Ashley Murray from Texas being our winner.

Susan Quam, Chairman gave her report of the Special MAA and Scholarship Committee. The report was sent out to membership via constant contact and was posted online as well. Susan is a past President of the Auxiliary in 1997 and a former Miss American Angus in 1985. She introduced and thanked her committee for all of their hard work and frank discussions. The committee was asked to look at the gender and bias issues so that they would to be able to best protect the Auxiliary from any legal issues that may arise because of these and how best to protect our programs now and in the future and to maintain their relevancy. The committee met 4 separate times for about an hour and a half to two hours trying to cover every point of view possible. Early on in the discussions, the MAA program was something that was determined by the committee that they wanted to preserve and to have only naturally born females be eligible for MAA and the scholarship be the vehicle for which she is selected. This led to several discussions about the scholarship program and their recommendations that the committee then put forth. The recommendations of the committee are:

- Each state can send two candidates of any gender to the American Angus Auxiliary scholarship competition. Each state will decide if they want to keep sending one of each gender or if they wish to change. In addition, scholarships will be awarded to the top 10 applicants, regardless of gender. This passed via motion by 3-2 margin with one committee member unable to attend the meeting.
- On the scholarship application, remove the check boxed for gender, with the state chair fills out. Replace it with a fill in the blank, completed by the applicant. This passed via motion 5-0.
- On the letter of intent for potential Miss American Angus contestants, add a check box: "I am a female assigned at birth and am eligible to serve as Miss American Angus". This passed 5-0.

Discussion and questions from the floor or via zoom were then held. April Bowman, Pamela Bramhall, Renee Radcliff, Anne Lampe, Rachel Frost, Mary McCurry, Linda Alexander, Kate Decker, Sheila Grobosky, Cortney Hill Dukehart Cates, Nancy Thelen, Brooke Harward all raised questions.

Susan Quam then made a motion: That on the letter of intent for potential Miss American Angus contestants that we add a checkbox that states, I am a female assigned at birth and am eligible to serve as Miss American Angus. In addition, she would like to have the language

checked by legal council to make sure that it is the appropriate language to ensure that intent to keep the Miss American Angus competition to biological females only is preserved. Discussion ensued.

Susan then withdrew her motion.

Deanna clarified that the committee served recommendations only and did not make any motions. Motions will need to be made from the floor and then voted on.

Cortney Hill Dukehart Cates made a motion: That we keep the scholarship "as is" with 5 boys and 5 girls. Cindy Ahearn seconded the motion. The motion was then amended by Cortney Hill Dukehart Cates to: We keep the scholarship with 5 boys and 5 girls and each state being allowed to submit 1 girl and 1 boy applicant. Cindy Ahearn again seconded the motion. Some discussion took place. A vote was taken. Motion passed.

Carolyn Gazda made a motion to word the letter of intent for Miss American Angus the same as what the special committee recommendation was.

Discussion was had to recommend that legal counsel be included to make the wording appropriate.

Carolyn Gazda then modified her motion to leave the wording the same as the committee's recommendation, to add a checkbox that states "I am a female assigned at birth and am eligible to serve as Miss American Angus" but have legal counsel through the Angus Association approve the wording to make sure that we are covered.

Betsy Michael seconded the motion.

Discussion ensued. A vote was called. Motion passed.

Pam Velisek made a motion that the Auxiliary allots up to \$2000 from the general fund for legal advice from the American Angus Association legal for the wording of the letter of intent.

Gretchen Clark seconded. A call for a vote was made. Motion passed by majority vote. Carol Wojciechowski made a motion to add a check box to have the applicant identify themselves as boy or girl instead of the state chair doing it.

Discussion was had.

Carol then amended her motion to: On the scholarship application, the applicant themselves selects either a male or female checkbox.

Becky Henderson seconded.

Vote was called for. Motion passed by a majority vote.

This being our 70th year, the Auxiliary has commissioned CJ Brown to do a painting of the Matriarchs of the Angus Breed. The painting honors 29 major cow families of the breed and includes our 68 past Presidents. The original painting will be auctioned off at the Auxiliary Breakfast during the Angus Convention in Salt Lake City, Utah. We will also be offering 5 Artist Proofs up for auction at that time also. 1 Artist Proof will be available on the Full Circle Online Auction on November 10th on Angus Live. Prints of the Painting will be available sometime after Louisville and ready to be shipped out before Christmas. Pre-orders will begin after the meeting and are available for \$100 plus \$30 for shipping.

Cortney Holshouser made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Michelle Reiff seconded the motion. Motion passed.



Your application for an American Angus Auxiliary scholarship has been received. Congratulations on the honor you have earned in representing your state and the great opportunity to compete on a national level.

As you probably know, the American Angus Auxiliary scholarship program is the basis from which contestants are chosen to compete for Miss American Angus. As a preliminary step to determine who is interested in competing (should their scholarship application place them in the position to do so) the following information is requested from you.

Each scholarship applicant is asked to declare her intent to compete once the national applications are received. The five highest placing scholarship applicants that choose to compete for Miss American Angus will automatically become contestants for Miss American Angus and will be announced at the National Junior Angus Show closing ceremonies in Grand Island, Nebraska.

To help you better understand the procedure of the contest and the role of Miss American Angus, we have included some important information that may be of help in making your final decision on whether to compete:

1) Miss American Angus Code of Conduct

The role of Miss American Angus is one of much importance and responsibility. The role of Miss American Angus is a public one. She serves as a role model for youth across the country and must present herself with dignity and grace.

promoting biological women's empowerment, self-confidence and service to others involved in the breed. A code of conduct and contract were initiated to ensure this continues. It is very important that you read the agreement, understand the guidelines and be willing to sign a contract stating that you agree to abide by the rules set forth if crowned Miss American Angus.

2) Miss American Angus Contest Agenda

All contestants are required to attend all activities. The contest will be in conjunction with the American Angus Association Annual Convention & Trade Show November 6-8, 2021 in Fort Worth, TX. A schedule of events for the contest has not been finalized at this time, but all contestants should be prepared to attend all three days and a final agenda will be sent to the contestants as soon as one becomes available.

3) Miss American Angus Required Event Attendance

Service as Miss American Angus will also require much time and willingness to devote to the Angus breed. Miss American Angus is **required and must commit** to attend six major shows and the annual convention & trade show. In addition to the required shows, Miss American Angus is encouraged to attend as many shows, sales, field days, banquets and promotional events as possible. A \$7000 travel expense fund is available to help with expenses. With careful planning, these funds should cover most of the expenses for the six required events.

In addition to the expense fund, Miss American Angus will be given an "official" jacket, crown and banner. A wardrobe allowance of \$200 will be presented along with a \$250 stationery and postage allowance. Additional gifts will be given depending on the sponsors acquired.

We have included an intent form that you will need to fill out, sign and <u>return to me no</u> <u>later than June 5, 2021.</u> This form allows you to declare your intent to compete for Miss American Angus. Your response does not affect your placement in scholarship results as the judges do not receive this information. The five winning contestants will then be contacted shortly after the show and provided with more detail on the competition along with some attire suggestions for each of the contest events.

Please note, should you declare your intent to compete for Miss American Angus, the American Angus Auxiliary will *reimburse* for one hotel room (at the Angus block rate), per candidate, for two nights of the competition. Either the auxiliary will pay for the hotel (room and taxes only) for the two nights while in Fort Worth, or the candidate will be responsible for sending in a receipt for reimbursement from the Auxiliary by December 1, 2021. We will confirm which way payment/reimbursement will be handled closer to the event.

Please read over the code of conduct carefully. Make sure that you understand what will be required of you (especially time commitment) if you are chosen to compete for Miss

American Angus. This allows all five contestants to have the same time frame for preparation.

2023 Miss American Angus Code of Conduct

As Miss American Angus, you are a role model to the youth across this country and an ambassador for the American Angus Auxiliary, American Angus Association, National Junior Association and all Angus breeders. In this role, your goals will be to include promotinge empowerment, self-confidence and service among biological women involved in the breed.

All actions you decide to act upon during your reign as Miss American Angus affects these Angus associations you represent. Therefore, it is of utmost importance you act in an appropriate manner at all times while you are in the public's eye attending livestock functions.

If it is determined you are acting or have acted in a manner that is inappropriate according to the guidelines set below, the American Angus Auxiliary has the right to take whatever action is deemed necessary.

Although general judgment should forbid you to act in a way unsatisfactory to the title of Miss American Angus, the following rules apply during your reign:

➤ No consumption of alcoholic beverages and use of drugs or tobacco products.

You should not put yourself in a position with ANY of the above around fellow junior Angus members, adult Association members, or other livestock personnel, regardless of breed.

- No inappropriate use of electronic media including photos, comments or posts on social networking sites (Facebook, YouTube, Instagram, SnapChat, TikTok, etc.), cell phone texts or images and email communication.
- ➤ No commission of any crime.
- Remaining unmarried until reign has been completed.
- Remaining in college until reign has been completed.



The Ways & Means Committee is currently working on a new plan for the Angus Gift Barn, a remodel so to speak. The "theme" of the gift Barn has to change to adapt with market trends.

2. How can the Executive Board or Auxiliary Council assist you with achieving your goals for your committee?

The Auxiliary Council could help my committee by deciding what direction they want the AGB to go in. The current display of vendors at shows is hard to compete with. The market of the AGB is mainly older women, and as such I find that the AGB has a hard time breaking into markets with younger generations. Yet, if the AGB sold items as all the other vendors did, what advantage would they have over those other vendors?

2. Is there an item or matter that you would like the Executive Board to discuss at their meeting? If so, what?

At multiple shows, the AGB has had the disadvantage of being placed/located at inconvenient and hidden booth locations as compared to other vendors. This greatly impacts sales. Also, unlike other vendors, the AGB is a nonprofit and only has a certain budget. Given this, it is difficult to find economically priced items to sell due to not being able to purchase items in larger quantities.

3. Do you have any suggestions to improve or enhance the Auxiliary?

I have found in being involved with the Auxiliary as an adult, not a lot of people even know what the Auxiliary is. I had a decent idea/understanding of it when I was showing, due to being involved with the royalty. However, I did not even know what the Auxiliary did. I believe that the purpose and mission of the Auxiliar should be promoted more, not just to Angus members either. I think if it is desired for the Angus Gift Barn to continue/survive, there needs to be a lot more awareness of the Auxiliary promoted. Larger than have been recently generated sales numbers seems to be a goal, however given the state of the economy a lot of individuals just don't have a lot of extra cash to throw around. Also, the merchandise that the AGB sells is very targeted to a group of people, which is mainly middle age to older women. Notable Activities/Fundraising in your Region:

The Texas Angus Auxiliary has finalized the sales of cook books and continues to provide graduating senior baskets at the state show. Texas will also be exploring the creation of branded merchandise to raise additional funds. Oklahoma Junior Angus does several fundraising activities throughout the year for their state and regional shows.

Colorado, Oklahoma, and Texas maintain a strong Angus royalty program to highlight young women in the Angus business.

All of the junior organizations have representation at NJAA events such as LEAD and Raising the Bar conferences. The Texas Angus Auxiliary and Junior Angus Association provide reimbursement to junior Angus members who attend and submit a form reflecting on their experience and learnings.

Challenges within your Region:

No active auxiliary organizations in Colorado, New Mexico, or Oklahoma. However, CO/OK are more involved in their junior programs.

Texas is challenged with maintaining membership once an auxiliary member's child has aged out of the junior organization. We generally see an uptick in membership around the time juniors start to look at scholarship opportunities, and then once the kiddo has applied, we find the parent's involvement fizzles out.

Additionally, the Texas Angus Auxiliary struggles to have personnel step up into leadership roles within the group. Often there is a little bit of coercion and a lot of ad hoc support that has to be given when leaders step down or "retire". I think there is opportunity for some mirroring of the AAAux when it comes to providing ample support and guidance for those who step into leadership roles.

Texas discussed term limits at our mid-year meeting and how we can better orient officers. Members volunteered to work with President Misty Wolf to help revive our officer orientation.

Opportunities within your Region:

Increased fellowship within the Auxiliary or Junior organization parents. I see an opportunity to network and capture potential or current members at AAA and state association sponsored sales.

I believe the Texas Auxiliary could better interface with the Texas Angus Association. There has been ample cooperation in the past, and I feel we've gotten away from that as the Auxiliary has become almost exclusively junior and show ring focused.

Goals for your role as a 2022-2023 Regional Director:

This year I hope to learn the ropes by listening and being observant of the tenured board members. I would like to make more connections in the states outside of my own (CO, OK, NM). I have some strong connections in Oklahoma that I would like to foster by visiting some of their junior events and the OYE/State Fair. Here I aim to meet some Angus juniors and their parents and provide resources and AAAux membership information.

I am looking forward to a year of fellowship and getting to know this amazing group of women whom I admire for so many reasons. I would enjoy being involved in a variety of committees to gain exposure to the many facets of the Auxiliary and how it interlaces with the Angus industry.


